- To complete an Art Badge you must produce work of a very high standard and to the best of your ability.
- This is a great achievement and requires a lot of creativity and thought. To obtain an Art Badge you must complete enough tasks to earn **15 stars**. You may do this with any of the following activities.
- Once you have completed the requirements hand everything into me at the Art Room and hand your \$10 to the office.

Draw a pencil self-portrait. You must show tone/value by using shading.		Go on a photo shoot. Select a topic and take a series of photos. Present a minimum of 15 of your best photos in hard copy. Include a paragraph about your selected topic. <u>You must be the photographer!</u>	 
Use magazine pictures and photos to create a montage. You should be trying to convey a message of some description. This can be 2D or 3D, with a maximum size A4.		Design and make a small kinetic sculpture. You may need to research Len Lye and other Kinetic artists to help you this this.	 
Create an Artwork entirely by using 'pattern' e.g. Koru, Kowhaiwhai, Zendoodle etc. Maximum size A3.		Make a mask. You can choose the materials, such as papier mache or plaster of paris. The mask must be made from scratch.	 
Illustrate a character (real or imaginary). Include their characteristics as part of the design. You should include a heading and an explanation. Maximum size A4.		Present a study on a New Zealand Artist. This can be in a format of your choice. It should include illustration, information IN YOUR OWN WORDS, and a bibliography. Maximum size A3.	 

<p>Present a chart showing the primary, secondary and complementary colours. Include a section on colour mixing and the colour wheel. Maximum size A3.</p>		<p>Choose a famous artwork from history or from contemporary Art. Copy it, keeping it to the artist's' style. Include a paragraph about why you chose this piece of Artwork. Maximum size A3.</p>	
<p>Make a 3-D clay sculpture. Try using Das, pumice, plasticine, or clay. Your options are limitless.</p>		<p>Create an Art history timeline to show Art movements and the major Artists. You should include major events in history as well. There should be some images included as well.</p>	
<p>Make a comic strip. It should be a story with a beginning, middle and an end. Please use a variety of angles and viewpoints to communicate your story. Maximum size A3.</p>		<p>Complete a painting on a topic of your choice on canvas. Using acrylic paint. Use paint mixing and techniques.</p>	
<p>Choose one of Leonardo Da Vinci's Drawings and copy it onto A4 size paper.</p>		<p>Make a detailed, accurate drawing using One Point Perspective. Look on the internet for examples and instructions. Maximum size A4.</p>	
<p>Make a collage using natural materials. You should research collage on the internet for ideas.</p>		<p>Use Two-point perspective to draw a cityscape or city scene. Look on the internet for examples and instructions. Maximum size A4.</p>
